# § 232-1. Statutory provisions adopted by reference. <sup>1</sup>

The statutory provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to orderly conduct in §§ 947.01 and 947.012, Wis. Stats., exclusive of any provisions therein relating to penalties to be imposed or punishment for violation of said statutes, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this chapter.

# § 232-2. Disorderly conduct.

Whoever does any of the following is in violation of the provisions of this chapter:

- A. In a public or private place, engages in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance; or
- B. With intent to annoy another makes a telephone call, whether or not conversation ensues.
- C. In addition to the foregoing adopted state statutes the following subsection is added thereto with the same force and effect, to wit: Operates a motor vehicle within the City of Buffalo City so as to cause or to be made any loud disturbing or unnecessary noise, such as may tend to annoy or disturb another.

## § 232-3. Violations and penalties.

The penalty for violation of any provision of this chapter shall upon conviction be a forfeiture of not more than \$100 together with the costs of prosecution.
