

**CITY OF BUFFALO CITY 2<sup>nd</sup> REGULAR MEETING-  
MONDAY, APRIL 19, 2021-MUNICIPAL BUILDING – 7:00PM**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Regular meeting of the City of Buffalo City Common Council was called to order by Mayor Kevin Mack at 7:00 p.m. Roll call: Jeannie Czaplewski, Larry Johansen and George Fuller. Also present: City Superintendent Stan Meier. Citizens Hank Rollinger, Ben Holien and Kim Beseler. The meeting was held as noticed.

Recreation - Rollinger represented the PYAA (Pirate Youth Athletics Association) and discussed the upcoming little league season with the council. Last year was the first year they ran little league as a community ball program including all kids from C-FC district. Will be playing in a conference that is similar to Dairyland conference this year with about 130 kids participating from our area. Council questioned the money left from C-BC. That will need to be clarified by the PYAA treasurer. Rollinger said practices will be starting soon at all fields including Buffalo City, Cochrane and Fountain City. Games will run from mid-May to beginning of July. Rollinger said there will be a full schedule of games in Buffalo City and concession stand will be open this year. There will also be one or two tournament weekends held in Buffalo City. Council said they will get the water turned on at the field. Rollinger will get the schedule to the city as soon as he has it. Meier will be putting in new bleacher boards this week. Rollinger confirmed that the program will be self-funded with no monies expected from municipalities.

Finance – Council discussed the Monarch Paving final bill. Monarch has said they will redo the bad spot in the municipal parking lot soon. Discussed the shouldering issue and not much else can be done. Some of the issues in the city are due to the wider streets. Talked about using future Monarch millings for upper spring lake surface. Fuller questioned if DNR would be okay with that.

Building permits - 1 permit issued since last week.

Riverfront – Discussed bid from Duellman Excavating for gravel at the upper spring lake landing. Council consensus that the parking lot is in very poor condition and should be redone before the kayak launch is installed soon. Bid total is \$11,400 and includes all gravel, spreading and packing. Motion Czaplewski, second Fuller to approve bid from Duellman for \$11,400 to gravel upper spring lake parking lot. Motion includes increasing the Riverfront budget by \$11,400. Funds will come from the sale of 6<sup>th</sup> Street lots earlier this year. All yes, motion carried.

Clerk – Board of Review will meet Thursday, May 12<sup>th</sup> from 5-7pm.

Outgoing Mayor Kevin Mack was recognized with a plaque for his 11 years of service on the city council; nine years as alderperson and 2 as Mayor.

Motion Czaplewski, second Johansen to pay bills as printed including SVEMS 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter bill and Monarch bill. All yes, motion carried.

Motion Johansen, second Fuller to adjourn. All yes. Motion carried.
