§ 324-1. Statutory authority and adoption by reference.

- A. This chapter is enacted pursuant to the authority granted by § 23.33(11), Wis. Stats.
- B. Statutory all-terrain vehicle laws adopted. The statutory provision describing and defining regulations with respect to all-terrain vehicles, including penalties for violations as set forth in § 23.33(1), (2), (3), (4), (4c), (4g), (4j), (4l), (4p), (4t), (4x), (4z), (5), (6), (7), (8), (10), (12) and (13), Wis. Stats., are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute or subsection thereof incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this chapter.

§ 324-2. All-terrain vehicle routes.

- A. No all-terrain vehicle may be operated on any City street in Buffalo City, Wisconsin, except upon designated all-terrain vehicle routes and in conformance with § 23.33, Wis. Stats.
- B. The following portion of Spring Lake Road is designated as an all-terrain vehicle route, to wit: That portion of Spring Lake Road extending from the southeast corner of Lot 1 of Stein's Addition to the City of Buffalo City; thence in a southeasterly direction to the east boundary of the City corporate limits.

§ 324-3. Violations and penalties.

Any person who violates this chapter shall forfeit not more than \$250.
